

2017 Thousand Oaks Reads 11th Annual One City, One Book

The Thousand Oaks Reads: One City, One Book 11th annual book selection for 2017 is News of the World by Paulette Jiles. This National Book Award Finalist for fiction tells the story of Captain Jefferson Kyle Kidd, in 1870 Texas who travels the state giving live readings to paying audiences hungry for news of the world.

After a "performance," a friend offers Kidd, an elderly widower, a \$50 gold piece to deliver a young orphan girl who had been captured by the Kiowa Indians, to her relatives in San Antonio. Their 400-mile journey south through unsettled territory and unforgiving terrain proves



difficult, and at times, dangerous.

Twice orphaned, girl has the forgotten what English she knew and is confused At and angry. first she tries to escape, refusing to act "civilized." Yet as the miles

pass, the two lonely survivors tentatively begin to trust each other, forging a bond that marks the difference between life and death in a treacherous land. News of the World is a brilliant work of historical fiction exploring the boundaries of family, responsibility, honor and trust. This book is perfect for fans of such classics as True Grit or the John Wayne classic, The Searchers.

Author Paulette liles is a novelist and poet. Her best-selling novels include Enemy Women, Stormy Weather and The Color of Lightning. Jiles graduated from the University of Missouri in Romance Languages and currently lives near San Antonio, Texas.



If you like movies, documentaries and howto videos you probably know that the Library is the go-to place for Blu-Rays and DVDs. Could this get any better? Yes it can, and it has! Drumroll please... Kanopy!

That's right, Kanopy, with a "K" and the Library subscribes to it. As if you didn't love movies from the Library enough already, now you can stream movies from the Kanopy streaming service. For you, lucky Thousand Oaks Library card holder, all you need to do is log in to the Library's website and start enjoying your favorite films!

Kanopy streams more than 26,000 films, everything from blockbusters to rare and obscure documentaries. It is one of the most unique and compelling collections of film on the planet, including indie films, foreign films, and must-see classics. It includes awardwinning documentary and feature films, with titles from PBS, BBC, Criterion Collection, Media Education Foundation, and more.

To access Kanopy, go to the library's website at www.tolibrary.org and click on the link to "Research". Then click on "Databases A to Z" and find Kanopy in the K's. Then, you will create an account with Kanopy, using your

Library card number and PIN. You can then access it on your computer or download the Kanopy app to view films on your mobile device. Or, if you have the Roku streaming service on your television, you can access Kanopy on your TV. I have Chromecast on my TV, so I was a bit surprised that the Kanopy app does not support casting. If you want casting there is a solution: you can download one of several third party apps that do support casting and run Kanopy through it.

You get five movie credits each month to use any way you want. You use a credit to check out a movie and you have it for 48 hours. Within those 48 hours you can watch the movie as many times as you want, at any time you want, on whatever devices you want. At the end of the month, your credits replenish back to five. You never have to wait because any number of users can have the same movie at the same time. Kanopy lets you keep a list of movies you want to watch so that when you have the time, you can watch from your list.

If you'd like more information on Kanopy or help accessing it through the Library's website, please let us know. Classes will also be offered later this Fall to help you get the most from your Kanopy account. $\tilde{*}$
