



Easy access to news from around the world now is available from the Thousand Oaks Library with PressReader, featuring over 4,000 newspapers from 100 countries, in 60 languages. PressReader is the world leader in out-of-market newspaper and magazine distribution, enabling publishers to reach their readership through innovative digital and networking solutions. In addition to search and bookmarking tools, PressReader also provides readers with a traditional 2-page newspaper view, table of contents, article jumps (linking article sections) and easyto-read text views.

Now readers can translate their newspaper instantly into one of ten major foreign languages. Six sections collect news of interest: Front page, News, Business, Sports, Entertainment, Editorial and more. Pick any of the last 7 days of the week or



point to Current. A news tickertape scrolls across the top and news can be narrowed down to Reader's Choice, All Sources, Editor's Picks or Librarian's Picks. Images of news flips, but can be paused, clicked through forward or back and clicking on the image brings up the related article, as well as thumbnail images of other featured articles. PressReader is platform-independent, requires no additional software or plugins, and works on both Windows and Macintosh systems. Enjoy world news at the Thousand Oaks Library today!



Juno and the New Renaissance

Saturday, September 12 • 2-3p.m. Grant R. Brimhall Library

Speaker: Theo Clarke Jet Propulsion Laboratory, Consultant on NASA's Juno mission to the planet Jupiter

NASA's Juno spacecraft was launched August 5, 2011. It looped around the sun and returned to Earth on October 9, 2013, for a gravity assist that slung it on its journey to the planet Jupiter. Juno will arrive at Jupiter on July 4, 2016 to begin a one-year investigation of that giant planet.

But Juno is much more than a robotic space laboratory to study the planet



Jupiter. Juno is the embodiment of a remarkable union of science, technology, history, literature, music, art, and public engagement. As Juno sails the cosmic sea to Jupiter it can be deemed an ambassador to the universe of a New Renaissance.

In a 27 year career at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory, Theo Clarke worked as scientist and engineer on the Mariner 10 mission to Venus and Mercury, the Voyager mission to the outer planets, and the Galileo mission to Jupiter. He is the recipient of NASA's prestigious Exceptional Service Medal for his

service and dedication to Galileo's Earth encounters. He has lectured on the U.S. space program all over the world, including to all three U.S. military academies. Clarke currently is an Adjunct Professor of Physics at Pasadena City College and a consultant on NASA's Juno mission to the planet Jupiter.

The Library will be holding a series of special programs throughout 2015 (for children and teens) based on Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics (STEAM).
