Director's Message



Tax season has just passed, but right now, all City Departments are deep into "budget season." Unlike many organizations that have annual budgets, the City of Thousand Oaks adopts a budget every two years -- to the great relief

of those of us who have to prepare the numerous documents, calculations and justifications for our future spending.

This year, to be more responsive to those who live, work and spend their time (and money) in TO, we've initiated a "budget engagement process." The budget engagement process is an online tool (www.toaks.org/yourbudget) that let's you play with the funding amounts of various departments and see what the impact is. Add more to the Library? We might be able to add more hours and programs...Take it away, and then you might see fewer programs or services. You also can experiment with funding for other services like Police and Recreation and Parks.

To ensure that whatever dollars allocated are spent wisely, City staff have also begun a process improvement and performance measurement initiative. Aimed at better aligning our services to meet the demands of our community, we are examining everything we do and looking for ways to do it better. For the Library, that could mean finding more programming to suit the needs of adults -- job training, technology skill building and enrichment opportunities designed to stimulate the mind and feed the soul -- or expanding literacy development opportunities for our elementary school students.

This may seem like a diverse collection of studies and projects but, if you look closely, you'll see a common element -- your genuine, honest feedback. This is your City, and more specifically, your Library, and we can't do what we do without your input. When we know what you want, we can better provide you with those services. So, get ready, this budget season's just begun.



In addition, it provides business videos, a help and advice

section, and information on how to create business plans.

Small Business Reference Center offers readers a collection of state-specific resources supported with demographic data and other local information. Completing the database are business videos that provide critical information for business owners including interviews, "lessons learned" features, lectures and "how to" videos to help foster success in all aspects of managing a business.

Contents include: more than 400 full-text periodicals, 450 full-text reference books, more than 630 business videos. Features include: state-specific resources, business basics, start-up kit and business plans, industry information by small business type, and a unique, user-friendly interface.

Secret Revealed! Your Thousand Oaks Library has thousands of feet of radio history including such favorites as Gunsmoke, Abbott and Costello, Bob Hope, and so much more.

One year ago, the Thousand Oaks Library Foundation received a grant from the Ahmanson Foundation to inventory approximately 3,000 linear feet of the Pacific Pioneer Broadcasters Association Collection. This collection is comprised of sound materials, sound equipment, sound effects, documents and the Billy Mills Orchestra sheet music collection. Carey Archival Services was contracted to conduct a thorough inventory of the collection. After many months of sweat and tears, the undertaking is complete! Would you like to know what we have found? Here is a glimpse.

The collection spans an entire range of recordings for both on-air and off-air purposes from the 1930s through the 1970s. The programs represented in this collection were intended for both national and local markets, and a significant number of the recordings are high quality master recordings. The most significant aspect of the Pacific Pioneer Broadcasters Collection is its incredible breadth and depth, as well as its recordings of local news and programming that likely are not available anywhere else. Included in the collection is the local broadcast about the 1943 Zoot Suit Riots, a news report about a January 1956 Santa Fe train wreck near Los Angeles Union Station that became the first major disaster in the Los Angeles area broadcast on live television, and a broadcast about the major flood that hit Southern California in

The goal of the Thousand Oaks Library Foundation is eventually to digitize the unique portions of the collection and make them available online to scholars, students and others around the world. Our next steps include seeking future federal and private funding to complete this process.
