**Book Club in a Box** kits contain ten (10) copies of a single title, discussion questions (when available), an author biography, and a group member sign-up sheet to help keep track of books.

### Borrowing Policy

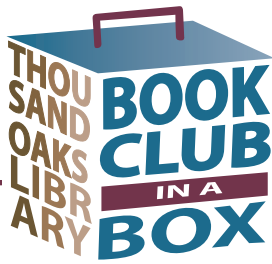
- Borrower must have a Thousand Oaks Library card.
- The box will be checked out on the library card of the person picking up the box, and that patron is responsible for the box and all of its contents.
- **The loan period is eight (8) weeks** and cannot be renewed.
- Holds cannot be placed online for Book Club in a Box.
