Exhibit case	Motorola 600 AM radio from 1956-57 - the antenna was contained in the bakelite handle, and the radio could be powered by cord, or by two batteries, a 9v "A" and a 90v "B."	(PPB Collection)
Exhibit case	Ethovox Speaker, 1924-25 made by Burndept. This British speaker was created for use with a radio set. The speaker had very high quality, and the knob allowed the user to adjust the distance between diaphragm and magnet. It sits on three lion feet, the horn is made of brass and aluminum. Exhibit case	Parakeet training record - yet another unusual disc collected by the PPB. This disc was made in the late 1950s or early 60s, and marketed as a new way to train a bird to talk.	(PPB Collection)
